Dear international doctoral candidates and postdocs,

While "Einblick(e)!" is intended to promote the conscious decision to pursue a doctorate, the mentoring programme for female doctoral candidates aims to support women on their academic path at an early stage. Some doctoral students at UPB have also expressed the wish to network with other doctoral students in order to exchange information on **quantitative research methods**. The aim is to learn from each other, discuss questions, share experiences and support each other with methodological challenges. 04.06.2025	<p>"Technologies d'avenir" scholarships for a research stay in France</p> <p>With the "Technologies d'avenir" scholarships, doctoral students and postdocs from German universities can spend 1-3 months at a French research institute (start of stay: 1 September - 31 December 2025). Focal areas include eco & energy transition, AI/quantum, health, culture & creative industries (see call for details).</p>	Doctoral candidates & postdocs
13.06.2025	<p>DAAD: Scholarships for going abroad during your PhD</p> <p>This programme supports research stays abroad during a doctorate. Stays abroad can last between one and twelve months.</p>	Doctoral candidates
13.06.2025	<p>DAAD: Scholarships for going abroad during your Postdoc</p> <p>Funding is provided for the realisation of a self-selected research project abroad. This can be an important qualification step for a later career in science, business or the cultural sector. The duration of the stay can be 3 to 6 months. Applications are open to academics of all disciplines with above-average qualifications who have completed their doctorate with very good results before starting the scholarship.</p>	Postdocs
01.07.2025	<p>Mentoring programme for female doctoral candidates</p> <p>The mentoring programme for female doctoral students is starting a new round in autumn and aims to support women early on in their scientific careers. The core elements of the programme are a one-year mentoring relationship with an experienced female scientist, intensive networking with female doctoral students from different faculties as well as career-relevant workshops and focused writing sessions. A digital information event with testimonials from former mentees will take place on 4 June at 1 p.m., for which you can register at go.upb.de/mentoringinfo.</p>	Female doctoral candidates

The peer mentoring programme for female students interested in a doctorate</p> <p>The peer mentoring programme offers prospective female graduates from all faculties the opportunity to discuss the prospect of a doctorate with other female students at an early stage. This exchange is accompanied by trained female doctoral students who provide tips and strategies for decision-making and for the path into academia. The first possible steps towards a doctorate are discussed together in a small group. In addition to these group meetings, the programme offers central fringe events and workshops with experts (e.g. on funding, application strategies and finding a topic). DAAD: Postdoctoral Researchers International Mobility Experience (PRIME)

With this programme, the DAAD supports international mobility in the postdoctoral phase through fixed-term positions at German universities. PRIME involves a 12-month secondment abroad and a six-month re-integration phase at a German university. With the research project of their choice and the stay abroad, PRIME Fellows gain an important qualification step for their future career in science.
